#### 総合型選抜

#### 第1問

ホームステイ先へのお土産についての自らの考えを、他者に対してわかりやすく英語で伝える力を問う問題。求められていることに的確に答える内容となっているか、アウトラインがわかりやすいか、スペルミスや文法の誤りがないか、英語の表現力があるかを採点の基準とする。

#### 模範解答

If I traveled abroad to study, I would bring my homestay family gifts representing my part of Japan. I would bring three things: a traditional box of sweets, my hometown's unique food, and images of my area. First, I would bring a box of *manju* (Japanese bean paste sweets) in the shape of our local mascot Yoshida-kun. He is a funny character, so it would be interesting to discuss. Secondly, I would bring some *Akaten*, a spicy snack from my hometown, to share the flavor of Hamada with my homestay family. #### 第2問

In my opinion meeting people from different cultures face-to-face is a way to overcome stereotypes. Stereotypes are often created through mass media such as newspapers and TV. People tend to believe false images toward people whom they do not know very well, because they cannot judge if the images reported on mass media are true or not. However, if they can meet and talk to people from other cultures in person, they will be able to find out what they heard from mass media is only part of the whole picture. For example, I thought all French people were fashionable, because France is a country of famous fashion brands. Last year, however, I realized it was wrong, because I met French tourists in Hiroshima. I was very surprised at their casual outfits: plain T-shirts, backpacks and sneakers, no Luis Vuitton or Channel. Thus, it is important to interact with people outside of our own cultures. (156)
